A five minute simple service of prayers and psalms usually takes place at the graveside at the time of the interment, usually led by the vicar. N.B. Once interred, cremated remains <u>cannot</u> be removed, as they are poured into the ground loose. On the rare occasions when we permit ashes to be buried in a casket it requires a Home Office exhumation order to move them subsequently. <u>Please read the graveyard rules</u> , <u>consider carefully and consult other family members before booking an interment</u> .
Declaration I understand that cremated remains buried in the graveyard may only be marked with gravestones complying with the churchyard rules, and installed with the permission of the vicar, and that no stones, hedges, or loose chippings may be used to border or infill the plot. A vase may be built into the gravestone, but loose vases must not be used. The PCC have the right to remove flowers when they fade, and to remove any items not permitted by the rules.
